Halfway around the Globe to Asbury University and All Nations Church

- MK-TCK(Third Culture Kid) Hayoung Koh, Part 1 -



Hayoung Koh, who shares the following story in the two ANMC Newsletters, was born in Korea, but followed her parents and went to the z mission field at the age of 7. There, growing up as an MK-PK for 12 years, she had to live in an unfamiliar environment, especially where there was no religious freedom, helping her parents in ministry. She came to Asbury University in Wilmore, Kentucky, the USA to study and major in Elementary Education. Attending All Nations Church, a missional church, Koh shares the feeling inspired by being served through All Nations United Methodist Church and All Nations Mission Center (ANMC) at this most important time in her life that contributes to the Kingdom of God.

Living as an MK (Missionary Kid) in a place where there was no freedom of expression meant sacrificing myself, eradicating loneliness, and being suppressed by more than I expected. Because I could not tell my parents about my hardships lest I burden my struggling parents and I did not have friends who understood my situation, the pain in my heart that had piled up was healed little by little as we attended All Nations Church. Since none of my friends could understand my situation, nor did I honestly tell my parents about the difficulties, the pain in my heart grew until I met All Nations Church. This is because there were church pastors and church members who worked behind the scenes so that I could meet MKs who grew up in a similar environment as me, unite as a church community, and share pain and joy with each other through the QT meeting so that the wounds in our hearts can be healed and we can grow in the Holy Spirit.

After entering Asbury University, I met All Nations Church while looking for a church with my friends. I will never forget the first impression with the pastors and church members who welcomed us saying that precious young people had come.
